# "The Unique Relationship of Prayer" Psalm 5:1-12

# I. The Psalmist goes to God in his struggle (vs. 1-3).

- A. There is a situation that drives him to go before God for help.
- B. He goes expecting God to hear him.
- C. He goes during a <u>specific</u> time of the day.

(Hebrews 4:14-16)

# II. The Psalmist goes to God knowing who God is (vs. 4-7).

- A. God hates sin.
- B. God is against those who are arrogant.
- C. God abhors bloodshed and deceit.

(Psalm 45:6-7; Proverbs 6:16-19; 13:5; Habakkuk 1:13; James 4:6; 1 Peter 5:5; 1 John 1:5)

# III. The Psalmist petitions the Lord based upon His character (vs. 8-12).

(Exodus 34:6-7; Proverbs 3:5-7; Matthew 15:18-20; 22:13; 25:30; Luke 6:43-45; John 8:44; Romans 1:24-28; Hebrews 6:7-8; 10:29-31; 2 Peter 2:9-10)

# **Scripture References**

## Hebrews 4:14-16

<sup>14</sup> Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. <sup>15</sup> For we do not have a high priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but One who has been tempted in all things as *we are, yet* without sin. <sup>16</sup> Therefore let us draw near with confidence to the throne of grace, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

#### 1 John 1:5

This is the message we have heard from Him and announce to you, that God is Light, and in Him there is no darkness at all.

#### Habakkuk 1:13

*Your* eyes are too pure to approve evil, And You can not look on wickedness with favor. Why do You look with favor On those who deal treacherously? Why are You silent when the wicked swallow up Those more righteous than they?

- <sup>6</sup> Your throne, O God, is forever and ever; A scepter of uprightness is the scepter of Your kingdom.
- <sup>7</sup> You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness; Therefore God, Your God, has anointed You With the oil of joy above Your fellows.

#### James 4:6

But He gives a greater grace. Therefore it says, "GOD IS OPPOSED TO THE PROUD, BUT GIVES GRACE TO THE HUMBLE."

#### 1 Peter 5:5

You younger men, likewise, be subject to *your* elders; and all of you, clothe yourselves with humility toward one another, for GOD IS OPPOSED TO THE PROUD, BUT GIVES GRACE TO THE HUMBLE.

#### Proverbs 6:16-19

<sup>16</sup> There are six things which the LORD hates, Yes, seven which are an abomination to Him: <sup>17</sup> Haughty eyes, a lying tongue, And hands that shed innocent blood, <sup>18</sup> A heart that devises wicked plans, Feet that run rapidly to evil, <sup>19</sup> A false witness *who* utters lies, And one who spreads strife among brothers.

### Proverbs 13:5

A righteous man hates falsehood, But a wicked man acts disgustingly and shamefully.

#### Proverbs 3:5-7

<sup>5</sup> Trust in the LORD with all your heart And do not lean on your own understanding. <sup>6</sup> In all your ways acknowledge Him, And He will make your paths straight. <sup>7</sup> Do not be wise in your own eyes; Fear the LORD and turn away from evil.

#### John 8:44

You are of *your* father the devil, and you want to do the desires of your father. He was a murderer from the beginning, and does not stand in the truth because there is no truth in him. Whenever he speaks a lie, he speaks from his own *nature*, for he is a liar and the father of lies.

#### Matthew 15:18-20

<sup>18</sup> But the things that proceed out of the mouth come from the heart, and those defile the man. <sup>19</sup> For out of the heart come evil thoughts, murders, adulteries, fornications, thefts, false witness, slanders. <sup>20</sup> These are the things which defile the man; but to eat with unwashed hands does not defile the man."

#### Hebrews 6:7-8

<sup>7</sup> For ground that drinks the rain which often falls on it and brings forth vegetation useful to those for whose sake it is also tilled, receives a blessing from God; <sup>8</sup> but if it yields thorns and thistles, it is worthless and close to being cursed, and it ends up being burned.

# Luke 6:43-45

<sup>43</sup> For there is no good tree which produces bad fruit, nor, on the other hand, a bad tree which produces good fruit. <sup>44</sup> For each tree is known by its own fruit. For men do not gather figs from thorns, nor do they pick grapes from a briar bush. <sup>45</sup> The good man out of the good treasure of his heart brings forth what is good; and the evil *man* out of the evil *treasure* brings forth what is evil; for his mouth speaks from that which fills his heart.

#### Exodus 34:6-7

<sup>6</sup> Then the LORD passed by in front of him and proclaimed, "The LORD, the LORD God, compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in lovingkindness and truth; <sup>7</sup> who keeps lovingkindness for thousands, who forgives iniquity, transgression and sin; yet He will by no means leave *the guilty* unpunished, visiting the iniquity of fathers on the children and on the grandchildren to the third and fourth generations."

# 2 Peter 2:9-10

<sup>9</sup> ...the Lord knows how to rescue the godly from temptation, and to keep the unrighteous under punishment for the day of judgment, <sup>10</sup> and especially those who indulge the flesh in *its* corrupt desires and despise authority.

#### Romans 1:24-28

<sup>24</sup> Therefore **God gave them over** in the lusts of their hearts to impurity, so that their bodies would be dishonored among them. <sup>25</sup> For they exchanged the truth of God for a lie, and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen. <sup>26</sup> For this reason **God gave them over** to degrading passions; for their women exchanged the natural function for that which is unnatural, <sup>27</sup> and in the same way also the men abandoned the natural function of the woman and burned in their desire toward one another, men with men committing indecent acts and receiving in their own persons the due penalty of their error. <sup>28</sup> And just as they did not see fit to acknowledge God any longer, **God gave them over** to a depraved mind, to do those things which are not proper,

#### Matthew 22:13

Then the king said to the servants, 'Bind him hand and foot, and throw him into the outer darkness; in that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'

# Matthew 25:30

Throw out the worthless slave into the outer darkness; in that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

# Hebrews 10:29-31

<sup>29</sup> How much severer punishment do you think he will deserve who has trampled under foot the Son of God, and has regarded as unclean the blood of the covenant by which he was sanctified, and has insulted the Spirit of grace? <sup>30</sup> For we know Him who said, "VENGEANCE IS MINE, I WILL REPAY." And again, "THE LORD WILL JUDGE HIS PEOPLE." <sup>31</sup> It is a terrifying thing to fall into the hands of the living God.
